



## Roberts Dairy Kansas City Plant Fact Sheet

### HISTORY

- The Kansas City plant was built in 1959 and underwent a major expansion in 1991 when Roberts Dairy acquired Fairmont and Zarda and merged the two dairies. The Fairmont-Zarda Dairy took the Roberts name in 1997.
- Omaha-based Roberts Dairy was founded in 1906.

### COMPANY

- The Kansas City Division employs approximately 275 people.
- The plant at 3805 South Emanuel Cleaver Blvd. is the only dairy that bottles milk locally in Kansas City, Missouri.
- The raw milk Roberts processes is supplied locally and is picked up from area dairy farmers, processed and delivered within a 24-72 hour time period to local stores, ensuring the freshest, safest, highest quality available.
- The Kansas City plant produces more than 37 million gallons annually and Roberts' products can be found in nearly every grocery store in the area.
- Roberts Dairy produces and provides local school children over 50 million \_-pint packages a year as a part of their school lunch program.
- Roberts Dairy sales have a multiplier effect to the Kansas City local economy in excess of \$80 million.

- The Kansas City plant processes white and chocolate milk, egg nog, orange juice and fruit drinks.
- In addition, the Kansas City plant bottles 16-oz. and \_-pint plastic milks and juices.
